

We have been thinking about the story of Jesus as it is rightly presented to us in the Gospel of Matthew:

- The completion of the story of God and Israel [humanity] (or, the story of redemption):
 - o Loving creation, sinful rebellion, gracious redemption

Remember, the beatitudes were about the fact that God helps those who cannot help themselves (= us! Poor...)

- That he brings a blessing to the unexpected and undeserving
- This is gracious redemption
 - o Israel's choosing: not big/strong; rich/powerful; right/righteous
 - o God's grace and God's purposes for the unexpected and undeserving

But there is one more thing that follows in the biblical story line after redemption, and that is restoration

- God, in Jesus, redeems us from the penalty and power of sin and then he begins a process of restoring us (and the world) to the intended state before the brokenness of sin
- (Ultimate is eschatological)
- That intended state is a close relationship with God wherein we share in His work

God is restoring things to original intent

• Creation: Genesis 1:26-28 (intent = nearness; co-ruling; blessing)

• Fall: Genesis 3:17-19 (fall = life is hard, then you die)

Redemption: Exodus 19:1-4 (redemption = God did Himself... what they could not do for themselves)

Restoration: Exodus 19:5-6 (restoration = nearness; co-ruling; blessing)

Redemption is the act of God saving

Restoration is the act of God bringing us near (own possession) and sharing His work (kingdom of priests)

Redemption/Restoration

- Isaiah 61:1-6a
 - Redemption; Cf. Beatitudes (vv. 1-3) (=blessed are)
 - Restoration; Cf. Salt and Light (vv. 4-7) (= you are)
- I.e. Having been redeemed and restored, we become restorers (already happened and in process)
 - 1 Peter 2:9-12, NASB
 - Revelation 1:4-6, NASB
 - Revelation 5:8-10, NASB (1995 Updated Version)
 - Revelation 20:4

I saw thrones on which were seated those who had been given authority to judge... they will be **priests** of God and of Christ and will **reign** with Him...

What Jesus is doing in our text (Matthew 5:13-16) is calling His disciples back to this intended role (priests/kings)

- Representing (priests); ruling (kings) (cf. the metaphor of salt and light)
- Adam; Israel; Church (our text... calling the unexpected and undeserving)

But, because Adam failed to walk in it and Israel failed to walk in it—Jesus walked among us as Priest and King

- Only in Him and with Him are we salt and light
- He took the **curse** for us to **redeem** and **restore** us
 - He became: Poor in Spirit; man of sorrows; persecuted
 - o He is the ultimate salt and light
 - E.g. Metaphor of light John 1:1-4, 9, and 8:12, NASB
 - Isaiah 60:1-3, NASB
 - = God's light on us; Subsequent light to the nations
 - Then, Jesus says we are the light
 - See the progression? (Cf. Exodus, Isaiah, Matthew)
 - o Matthew 4:13-16 and 5:13-16 (comparison)
 - Redemption (Jesus as light) | Restoration (His people also as light)



This idea of salt and light corresponds to God making us priests and kings (or queens)

- Mediating and ruling (representing and walking in righteousness)
- Only because Jesus has come as the ultimate priest and King (Mediator and ruler)

Both salt and light are images for impact on something else (without pressing the metaphor)

- How we influence the world (those around us)
 - o Part of the ongoing process of **restoration** and **renewal**
- The **danger** of **diminished** influence (not salty; hidden light)
 - o E.g. Israel when they were not dealing with wickedness in themselves and their land
 - o God called them to repent and then said: Isaiah 58:8-12, NASB (your light; repair and restore)
 - o Cf. Matthew 5:16 (good works as witness)
 - A hard call...
 - But... 2 Corinthians 2:14, NASB

So, how might we think about our impact? (how is God leading us in His triumph in Christ... sweet aroma?)

- That is the Christian adventure
 - o It can look different for all of us in our unique life spaces... (friends, vocation, parenting, platforms)
- How, as one saved by Jesus, do I now make my life count for His purposes?
 - o How can I mediate God's presence and love? (Faithful priest)
 - o How can I co-rule with Christ in righteousness? (Good king/queen)

1 Peter 2:9-12, NIV
