1. Purposeful in prayer

7 The end of all things is near; therefore, be of sound judgment and sober spirit for the purpose of prayer.

- God loves His Son and has a wonderful plan to bring all the nations into worship of Him, and God loves you enough to include you in that plan
 - The consummation calls for consecration
 - Consummation = Kingdom, judgment, justice, restoration, make new
 - Consecration = to make or declare sacred; formally dedicated to God
 - o Joshua 3:5

Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do wonders among you

- NIV = be clear minded and self-controlled so that you can pray
- NKJV = be serious and watchful in your prayers
- = being purposeful about prayer in light of God's goals
- The point it: Because Christ is coming again...
 - We should have the aroma of prayer in our lives
 - o Cnt. The boys in Gethsemane
- The last 2 weeks connect here:
 - o 4-year-olds theology... that only sees tomorrow for what it hold for them
 - Revelation 7 and God's goals
 - If we catch a vision for God's goals and caring about others—we will pray

2. Laden with love

8 Above all, **keep fervent** in your **love** for one another, because **love** covers a multitude of sins.

- Love covers = forgives and disregards the offenses of others (Amplified Bible)
- When love is abounding:
 - o Small and even large offences are overlooked and forgotten

- Where love is lacking:
 - o Every offence is taken note of and remembered
 - o Suspicion, jealousy, misunderstanding and conflict abound
 - o And Satan is delighted

3. Happily hospitable

9 Be hospitable to one another without complaint.

- The original setting
 - Idea = being generous to guests
- The overarching idea is that we, as Christians, are ready to care for one another
 - o And people in general

4. Serving as stewards

10 As each one has received a special gift, employ it in serving one another as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

- What if we?
 - o 1. Approached life this way
 - o 2. Did church this way
- Moving from being served to being a servant
- Moving from ownership to stewardship

s. Glorifying God

11 Whoever speaks, is to do so as one who is speaking the utterances of God; whoever serves is to do so as one who is serving by the strength which God supplies; so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belongs the glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.

- · Peter mentions two sort of broad categories of gifts here: speaking and serving
- But this is not meant to be exhaustive, but rather illustrative
 - "Whatever God has gifted you to do... do it by and for Him and make it all about Him."
