Revelation 1:12-20 | A Glorious Vision of Christ

Remember the context

- These churches needed to be reminded of the greatness of Jesus—the glory of Christ
- The world seemed out of control for God's people
 - o Personally for John
 - o Globally under the Roman Empire
- The church seemed insignificant, irrelevant and powerless
 - o A contrary kingdom with a contrary Lord
 - o Unpopular, outnumbered, targeted
- "The Christians were a pitiably small group, persecuted by mighty foes. To all outward appearance their situation was hopeless. But it is only as Christ is seen for what he really is that anything else can be seen for what it really is." –Leon Morris¹

I. The example of John (verses 9-10)

9 I, John, your brother and <u>fellow</u> partaker in the tribulation and kingdom and perseverance which are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus.

10 I was in the Spirit on the Lord's day, and I heard behind me a loud voice like the sound of a trumpet

- John was suffering for being faithful (because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus)
- John was seeking the Lord in His suffering (in the Spirit)
- The result was clear revelation (like the sound of a trumpet)
- And great comfort
- Questions:
 - o What do you suffer for?
 - o What do you seek when you suffer? (or, whom?)
 - What does that get you? (or, what do you hear as a result?)
 - I.e. The truth of the glory, power and majesty of Christ above all!!!!

II. The center of the church (verses 12-13°, 20)

12 Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking with me. And having turned I saw seven golden lampstands;

13 and in the middle of the lampstands one like the son of man...

20 ... the seven lampstands are the seven churches.

7 = number of completeness

• The churches were actual churches in real places, but they represented all churches

The lamps symbolize churches as lights in a dark world

Philippians 2:15 (NASB)
 Do all things without grumbling or disputing; so that you will prove yourselves to be blameless and innocent, children of God above reproach in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you appear as lights in the world

Jesus is there

- Matthew 28:20; John 14:18
- The vision reminds the church (we who are the church) of what it is all about
 - Jesus at the center
 - Jesus as the source
 - Jesus as the goal

Leon Morris, Tyndale New Testament Commentaries: Revelation (Downers Grove, Ill.: IVP, 1987), 57.

- This is the church's secret
 - o This is all we have going for us
 - We need to be faithful and attentive to this reality
 - o To, for, around (The gathering and the scattering)
- The church is meant to be centripetal
 - Tending to move toward the center
- What is at the center of your church going—spirituality—your life
 - o Your needs?
 - o Your agenda?
 - o Your pain?
 - A person?
 - o A politic?
 - o A preference?

Jesus is the one who is **in the middle** of the lampstands

- The churches
- Our lives as "the church"

III. The vision of Christ's glory (verses 13-16)

13 and in the middle of the lampstands I saw one like a son of man, **clothed in a robe** reaching to the feet, and girded across His chest with a golden sash.

14 His head and His hair were white like white wool, like snow; and His eyes were like a flame of fire.

15 His feet were like burnished bronze, when it has been made to glow in a furnace, and His voice was like the sound of many waters.

16 In His right hand He held seven stars, and out of **His mouth** came a sharp two-edged sword; and **His face** was like the sun shining in its strength.

= Jesus as God

His clothing

- a robe (God in glory)
- Isaiah 6:1

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, lofty and exalted, with the train of His robe filling the temple.

- a golden sash (OT priest)
- Hebrews 4:14-16 (NLT)
 - 14 So then, since we have a great High Priest who has entered heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to what we believe.
 - 15 This **High Priest** of ours understands our weaknesses, for he faced all of the same testings we do, yet he did not sin.
 - 16 So let us come boldly to the throne of our gracious God. There we will receive his mercy, and we will find grace to help us when we need it most.

His head and His hair

- Daniel 7:9
 - I kept looking until thrones were set up, and the Ancient of Days took His seat; His vesture was like white snow and the hair of His head like pure wool.
- Deity and purity

Psalm 51:7 (NASB) – The Prayer

Purify me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

Isaiah 1:18 (NASB) - The Promise

"Come now, and let us reason together," says the LORD, "Though your sins are as scarlet, they will be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they will be like wool."

Jesus is fulfilled promise and answered prayer concerning purity (forgiveness)

o 1 Corinthians 5:21

His eyes

- Deity and judgment
- Daniel 10:6 (a Theophany)

His body also was like beryl, his face had the appearance of lightning, his eyes were like flaming torches, his arms and feet like the gleam of polished bronze, and the sound of his words like the sound of a tumult.

- Fire in scripture speaks of judgment
- Hebrews 4:13

Nothing in all creation is hidden from God. Everything is naked and exposed **before his eyes**, and he is the one to whom we are accountable.

His feet

Daniel 10:6 (a Theophany)

His body also was like beryl, his face had the appearance of lightning, his eyes were like flaming torches, his arms and feet like the gleam of polished bronze, and the sound of his words like the sound of a tumult.

- Deity and sovereign strength
 - Cf. Roman empire of Daniel 2 (strong but brittle—fractured, not adhered)
 - Jesus seen in contrast to these flawed feet
 - He is the sure and lasting foundation
- Bronze is an alloy of iron and copper
 - o Iron is strong, but it rusts
 - Copper won't rust but is pliable
 - o Combine the two and you have the best qualities of each—strength and endurance
 - The everlasting Kingdom
- All other kingdoms in the world have feet of (stand on) something less
 - OG context = great encouragement

His voice

- Another picture of deity
- Ezekiel 43:2 (NLT)

Suddenly, the glory of the God of Israel appeared from the east. The sound of his coming [voice] was like the roar of rushing waters, and the whole landscape shone with his glory.

- Context was a future promise of Israel to deal with false gods and restore HIs presence nad glory to them—His feet standing in the temple
- o OG Context (Caesar)

His right hand

- 7 Stars (see verse 20)
- Represents leaders (messengers) in the churches
- Right hand is the picture of strength and protection (Jesus is the head of the church)
- Isaiah 41:10 (NASB)

Do not fear, for I am with you; do not anxiously look about you, <u>for I am your God.</u> I will strengthen you, surely I will help you, surely I will uphold you with My righteous right hand

His mouth

- o The Word of God
 - Eph 6 (offensive)
 - Rev 19:21 (effective)
 - Isaiah 11:4 (NASB) (righteous judgement)

But with righteousness He will judge the poor,

And decide with fairness for the afflicted of the earth;

And He will strike the earth with the rod of His mouth,

And with the breath of His lips He will slay the wicked.

o Hebrews 4:12 (NLT)

For the word of God is alive and powerful. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword, cutting between soul and spirit, between joint and marrow. It exposes our innermost thoughts and desires.

His face

- Cf. Daniel 10:6 (like lightening)
- Speaks of Glory
- Speaks of the hope of Israel
- Numbers 6:22-27 (NASB)
 - 22 Then the Lord spoke to Moses, saying,
 - 23 "Speak to Aaron and to his sons, saying, 'Thus you shall bless the sons of Israel. You shall say to them:
 - 24 The Lord bless you, and keep you;
 - 25 The Lord make His face shine on you,

And be gracious to you;

26 The Lord lift up His countenance on you,

And give you peace.'

27 "So they shall invoke My name on the sons of Israel, and I then will bless them."

Jesus is the fulfillment of the promised blessings of God!!!

★The 7 stars represent the leaders of the seven churches—They are in His hand

- You do not see stars when the son is shining
 - o and **in the middle** of the lampstands I saw one like a son of man (v. 13)
 - His face was like the sun shining in its strength. (v. 16)

Verse 17

- o When I saw Him, I fell at His feet like a dead man
- And He placed His right hand on me, saying, "Do not be afraid; I am the first and the last
 - We have already been told that Jesus is holding the 7 stars in His right hand...
 - How can He also touch John and do both with the one hand?
 - John is talking in symbols and it is the symbolism that is important, not the possibility of our reconstructing the picture²
 - Here is the sovereign ability of our Lord:
 - At the same time, He holds the whole church in His hand (the whole world!), and takes action for the needs of the individual
 - o Both truths are glorious and pictured here

Only Jesus!!!

o Verses 17b-19

Remember: We will suffer

- o But what for?
- o And how? Or, Who will we turn to and what will we hear and see when we do?
- May it be Christ and only Christ who sustains us and upholds us with His righteous right hand
