# Revelation 6 | The Kindness of God Revealed in His Patient and Progressive Judgment

The gist of Chapter 6 is that God's judgment has come to earth

- Future—Tribulation period—Unfolds over time (kindness)
- It was preceded by the Cross and the age of grace—It will be followed by the renewal of all things
- Judgment is **not** ultimate (i.e. the final event)—renewal and reconciliation and righteousness are
- But before those final chapters (21-22), there are several chapters that reveal God's judgment

To be sure, the imagery and language and pictures given us in Revelation are meant to cause shock and awe

- But not so much for the purpose of fear—but rather as a wake up call
  - For the world (repent)
  - o And for the church (righteousness & mission)
- This is God's kindness
  - o Because sin destroys (a God of love will judge sin)
  - o Calling us away from it is kindness
  - o Both in escaping the destructive nature of sin—but also in escaping God's judgment of it

Last week in Chapter 5 we saw Jesus presented as the only one who is worthy to bring God's **judgment and justice** to the world because He is the one who brought God's **grace and mercy** to the world through the Cross (CF. The Lion and the Lamb)

- Christ, having accomplished the ultimate act of grace and mercy...
- ... Is now going to unleash judgment and justice on those who deserve it (and refused mercy)

## Remember:

- Grace and mercy were offered first
  - o John 3:16-17 (NASB)
- God is surprisingly slow to judge
  - o Psalm 145:8 & 17 (NASB)
- Some would say too slow
  - o 2 Peter 3:9 (NASB)
  - o Cf. Revelation 6:9-10

#### What we see in this chapter is:

- The Kindness of God Revealed in His Patient and Progressive Judgment
- His wrath is not poured out all at once in an absolute manner (unfolds in discernable, foretold stages)
- His judgment comes progressively because of His desire for people to be saved
  - o God is leaving room for repentance at every point
    - God has always done so and has always made that plain
    - Acts 17:30-31 (NASB)
  - Many will repent—many won't
    - See: **6:16-17**
    - See: 16:8-11
      - This shows both the **mercy** and **justice** of God
        - o He has shown **mercy** in leaving room for repentance
        - He is **just** in punishing those who refuse to repent (love = judgment)
        - o Their refusal to repent shows their colors
          - John 3:18-19 (NASB)

Even though in Revelation 6, the day of God's judgment has come to earth—it comes patiently and progressively—because God is kind and loving

This is shown in the <u>progressive breaking</u> of the 7 seals (imagery ad pictures used here)

## **The Seven Seal Judgments**

| <u>The Seal</u>                  | <u>Contents</u>         | <u>Jesus' Foretelling</u> |
|----------------------------------|-------------------------|---------------------------|
| 1 <sup>st</sup> Seal (vv. 1-2)   | False Messiah           | Matthew 24:3-5            |
| 2 <sup>nd</sup> Seal (vv. 3-4)   | Worldwide War           | Matthew 24:6-7a           |
| 3 <sup>rd</sup> Seal (vv. 5-6)   | Famine                  | Matthew 24:7b-8           |
| 4 <sup>th</sup> Seal (vv. 7-8)   | Death                   | Matthew 24:21-22          |
| 5 <sup>th</sup> Seal (vv. 9-11)  | Justice for the Martyrs | Matthew 24:9-10           |

# Commentary on the above:

# The first 4 seals (The 4 Riders of the Apocalypse)

- Sometimes God's judgments take the form of:
  - o His allowing people's own desires/actions to run their course
  - o And for them to experience the consequences
    - Cf. See: Romans 1:20-32 (NLT)
  - This seems to be the nature of this first phase of God's judgment—allowing human choices to run their courses (Cf. the first 4 seals)
    - False Savior, War, famine, pestilence, death, inflation + injustice in the marketplace...
    - These are the outworking of God's moral laws (Cf. Physical laws)
    - This shows us that even when the world seems out of control—God is still the one in power
- The beginning of a specific period of time of God's judgment on earth (cf. birth pangs) = God allowing humanity's sin and its consequences to run its full course

## The 5<sup>th</sup> seal

- Persecution = major issue at the time and a major issue in the future (as it is now)
- The martyrs' prayers for justice is answered in Revelation 16:5-7

#### The 6<sup>th</sup> seal

- This may mean that there is actual changes in the physical universe (cosmic convulsions) caused by God
  - Certainly would be an attempt to get people's attention (as God wants to)
  - o Cf. Matthew 24:27, 29-30
- This sort of imagery is seen frequently throughout the OT to describe social and political upheaval
  - o Cf. Jeremiah 4:23-26, where the desolation caused by foreign invaders is intended
- May mean that the whole system of this world is so turned upside down and in chaos—that the
  language and imagery in the text symbolizes this chaos by speaking of the shaking of things which
  seem so fixed and stable and reliable (sun, moon, stars, mountains)

# Either way, we begin to see humanity's reaction to God's judgment

- Revelation 6:15-17
- Even though they know this is God's judgment—they would rather die than repent

### John 3:19-21 (NASB)

19 This is the judgment, that the Light has come into the world, and **men loved the darkness** rather than the Light, for their deeds were evil.

**20** For everyone who does evil hates the Light, **and does not come to the Light** for fear that his deeds will be exposed.

**21** But **he who practices the truth** comes to the Light, so that his deeds may be manifested as having been wrought in God.
